Leo Goneau, immediate Past President of the Association, informs us that there was a large turnout of friends of Charley Doyle and his family at the funeral service in the CFB SHEARWATER Chapel on 15 Oct 92. Charley joined the RCN in 1957, originally in the Air Branch, before switching to the Clearance Diver Branch in 1959. He served in HMCS GRANBY, Indian Head USA and HMCS CORMORANT, progressing in rank to CP01 Clearance Diver before being Commissioned as a Lieutenant. Charley was on his retirement leave and working part time for H&R Block. He died of a heart attack whilst on a diving expedition at Sandy Cove in Terrence Bay, N.S. Sunday morning, 11 Oct 92. Officiating at his funeral service was one of his long time diving buddies, William 'Darby' Mathews - now Reverend Mathews, whose parish is in Kennetcook, Nova Scotia. DOYLE, Lieut. Lloyd Emmerson (Charley) - 54, Lower Sackville, died October 11, 1992, in Sandy Cove Beach, Terrence Bay. Born in Hamilton, Ont. he was a son of the late Lloyd and Mary (Peters) Doyle. He retired after serving 35 years with the Royal Canadian Navy, CFB Shearwater. He spent most of his career with the Fleet Diving Unit Atlantic and was head instructor of Shearwater Scuba Club. He was executive member of Naval Divers Association; instructor at Saint John Ambulance; former member of Kinsmen Club. He was a part time employee with H&R Block. He is survived by his wife, the former Bonita Marie (Bonnie) Gay daughter, Rhonda, Lower Sackville; son, Chris Lower Sackville; stepson, James Lewis, London Ont.; brother, John, Stoney Creek, Ont.; five sisters Vera (Mrs. Les Haydon), Hamilton; Shirley (Mrs. Gary Arnott), Evelyn McMillan, Kathleen (Mrs. Jim Thoms), Debbie Dickinson, all of Stoney Creek; three grandchildren; a step-granddaughter.
