He was a veteran of the Second World War; member of Navy Officers Association; Chief Petty Officers Association; Canadian Naval Divers Association and Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 26, Truro. He was a member of Burns Lodge 10, Halifax; Botsford Chapter 7, Moncton; Luxor Temple and First United Church, Truro. He is survived by a son, Robert Dartmouth; two grandchildren. He was predeceased by two sisters, Jean, Catherine (Kay); two brothers, Roy, David (Allison). The body is in Matatal Funeral Home, Truro, visiting 2-4, 7-9 p.m. today, where a legion service will be 7 p.m. tonight and where funeral will be 2 p.m. Tuesday, Rev. Chalmers Hatcher officiating.
